



Antonio "Tony" Campos was born in the Northern Basque region of Spain, three miles from the French border. At 17 Tony moved to the United States on a contract where he worked herding sheep in Wyoming and California. Three years later Tony became a US citizen and began farming along with his older brothers, establishing Campos Brothers Farms. They settled into the Caruthers area in the 1956. Over the years they farmed many different items including hay, black eye beans, raisins and cotton to name a few. In 1971 they began farming almonds and by 1981 the first Campos Brothers Farms Commercial Almond Huller was built. Today, Tony and his wife Juliet, together with their 3 children who manage the daily operations, have a diversified farming company that includes wine grapes, walnuts and an Almond Handling business that exports to over 45 countries worldwide. Tony has served on both the Caruthers Union Elementary and High School boards. Throughout the years Tony has been active in and supporter of many organizations, the Fresno Basque Club, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Right to Life, Valley Children's Hospital, Ag One Foundation, Catholic Charities, Poverello House, Saint Agnes and Nazareth House, FFA, 4H and Lions Club.
